FECC Routine Care and Refraction Waiver

Medicare and an increasing number of commercial insurance carriers (*ex. BCBS*, *Medcost*, *UHC*) do not cover *refractions*.

Refraction is the part of your eye exam where the doctor places trial lenses in front of your eyes to obtain your eyeglass/contact lens prescription. You may or may not have this test performed today as part of your visit. Please let us know how you wish to proceed if such service is performed.
